RESPONSIVE READING:

1 Samuel 14:1-10

- Leader:** Now it came to pass upon a day, that Jonathan the son of Saul said unto the young man that bare his armour, Come, and let us go over to the Philistines' garrison, that *is* on the other side. But he told not his father.
- People:** And Saul tarried in the uttermost part of Gibeah under a pomegranate tree which *is* in Migron: and the people that *were* with him *were* about six hundred men;
- Leader:** And Ahiah, the son of Ahitub, Ichabod's brother, the son of Phinehas, the son of Eli, the LORD'S priest in Shiloh, wearing an ephod. And the people knew not that Jonathan was gone.
- People:** And between the passages, by which Jonathan sought to go over unto the Philistines' garrison, *there was* a sharp rock on the one side, and a sharp rock on the other side: and the name of the one *was* Bozez, and the name of the other Seneh.
- Leader:** The forefront of the one *was* situate northward over against Michmash, and the other southward over against Gibeah.
- People:** And Jonathan said to the young man that bare his armour, Come, and let us go over unto the garrison of these uncircumcised: it may be that the LORD will work for us: for *there is* no restraint to the LORD to save by many or by few.
- Leader:** And his armourbearer said unto him, Do all that *is* in thine heart: turn thee; behold, I *am* with thee according to thy heart.
- People:** Then said Jonathan, Behold, we will pass over unto *these* men, and we will discover ourselves unto them.
- Leader:** If they say thus unto us, Tarry until we come to you; then we will stand still in our place, and will not go up unto them.
- ... All:** But if they say thus, Come up unto us; then we will go up: for the LORD hath delivered them into our hand: and this *shall be* a sign unto us.

A message from our Pastor

Praise the LORD, Saints!

“But where are the nine?” *Luke 17:17 KJV*

This is one of the questions that Jesus asked the one leper who came back to thank Him for his healing. Jesus knew where the nine were physically and spiritually, but the place they were in, was not enough to influence the one leper-free man to stay with them.

When miracles happen in our lives, it can sometimes change our thinking. We become excited about our new situation and quickly lose a sense of self. In other words, we forget where we came from. This leper didn't, but the other nine did. Our intentions are good but sometimes misdirected. It isn't that we always forget to say thank you to our benefactor but the new place we're in has us in awe.

Some people can't believe what they're seeing in the new environment that they are in. Jesus told all ten lepers to go show themselves to the priests for evidence of their healing. The healings meant they were ready to be readmitted into the mainstream of life. As lepers, they had been colonized away from others. We too, sometimes, get ostracized from our preferred circles because we look different, act different or carry an ugly, non-contagious look that appears contagious.

Looks matter to all of us. We say it doesn't matter but it does. All of us have some reservations about who we want to be seen with and who we don't. We try to protect our reputations from stigmatized gossip and undesirable questions, simply because how we are seen and who we are seen with matters. Jesus knows that. It's why he sent them to the priests.

It was the priest's job to vouch for their healings and present them to the people. Two things I noticed. Number one, they were sent to the priests instead of the scientific sector for research, observation and a stamped card of approval. The Master healer had already cleared them. That means Jesus knows what He's doing.

Pastor's message continued

Number two, going back to church is always great regardless of how long you've been away. Those nine went to the church to try to get back in with what they had been missing. So, if you know anyone whose been away from church for a while because of some spiritual or self-pitied colony they've been sent to, tell them to come see me first, and let me present them to the people healed and totally made whole.

You are totally whole only when you know Jesus. The people may not see it in you. The priests may not see Jesus in you either. Pity on the priests and people who turn others away who have been sent by Christ. My belief is, if one wants to come home to the church, Jesus must have sent them. No one seeks salvation, salvation knocks on your door.

The other nine obviously looked to glorify God in the wrong places. They wanted to be with their friends of the past and reunite with loved ones. That's human nature when we desire to be accepted in our circles. When you look at the one leper who came back to say thank you and glorify God, he broke away from his past and put all else on hold, because God deserved the glory, first.

One last note. The leper was a Samaritan who was unfamiliar with Judaism. The Israelites called Jesus Master while sick but ignored him when made well. The Samaritan leper called Jesus while sick too but praised him when he got well. It's why Jesus tells him, your faith made thee whole in the physical, mental and spiritual. The other nine were healed physically, but uncertain mentally and still lost spiritually.

Some people have been healed and haven't been made whole because ninety percent of them are seeking their past with others instead of their future with Jesus. That means that only ten percent of us know our future.




Juneteenth Day

Juneteenth Independence Day
(June 19, 1865)

Juneteenth is also called Emancipation Day or Juneteenth Independence Day. It is celebrated on June 19th commemorating the end of slavery in the United States.

The first official Juneteenth celebration took place in Texas in 1866. The observances would include prayer meetings, singing spiritual songs and new clothes to represent their newfound freedom.

It became a state holiday in Texas in 1980 and several other states have followed suit. As of now only two states do not recognize the day. It is also celebrated outside of the United States by organizations in other countries who recognize the end of slavery while celebrating the culture and achievements of African Americans.

Juneteenth is a combination of the words "June" and "nineteenth."

There is also a flag that represents its history and freedom of the American Slaves and their descendants. The design is a bursting new star on the horizon. The star represents a new freedom, a new people, a new star. The colors red, white and blue communicate that the American Slaves and their descendants were all Americans
