

Refrain




Bring - ing in the sheaves, bring - ing in the sheaves,

The first line of the refrain consists of two staves. The treble staff has a key signature of one flat (Bb) and a common time signature (C). The melody starts on a G4, moves to A4, then Bb4, and has a repeat sign before C5. The bass staff provides a harmonic accompaniment with chords on G3, Bb3, and C4.





The second line of the refrain continues the melody. The treble staff melody goes from C5 down to Bb4, then A4, and has a repeat sign before G4. The bass staff accompaniment continues with chords on G3, Bb3, and C4.

A message from our Pastor

Praise the LORD, Saints!

"But God led the people about through the way of the wilderness of the Red Sea"

Exodus 13:18 KJV

The people of Israel had just been released from Egypt's tyranny by the hands of Pharaoh when God redirected their travel plans. God did not want Israel looking back at Egypt because it would entice them to stay in slavery's comfort rather than pursue the Promised land.

God took them on a route that proved challenging to their will, determination and trust. The will to want better comes from within an individual. No one can make you want better for yourself but you. Israel was a community of people who had to decide individually on a better life or return to Egypt.

The Israelites knew what they were leaving behind in Egypt and only had partial expectations of their future based on their leaders comforting words. Moses led them as God instructed, but the people needed to determine within themselves if they really had belief in a new way of life existing. They had many years of awful experiences in Egypt, but the outlook of a future was not so evident or within their vision.

With Pharaoh's army in close pursuit, they seemed hopelessly trapped in the valley with the Red Sea up ahead. They were determined to keep moving forward but their trust factor in Moses and his God was growing dim.

We are in a valley as a church. We have mountains of COVID-19 on each side of us with one strain greater than the other. Pursuing us is the racist past that beckons for people of color to be under the tyranny of slavery. Up ahead we can smell the salts of the Red Sea because of our familiarity with detecting dangerous waters.

The change in the federal office looks promising but we've heard those stories of a promised land before. The church will not be fooled again. The church is you, individually and collectively. I believe, however, that God will part the Red Sea

and send us across dry ground to a better church, a better community and a better future.

Our job is to will ourselves to reach that place, determined not to be misled with political propaganda and socially self-inflicted issues but trust God with all our hearts as we vow to do every day. It is my duty to keep you encouraged, especially during these difficult, different, unexpected times.

God's will is my will. My determination is anchored by His Holy Spirit. The trust I have in God today is greater than ever and growing more and more each day. Soon, we will be back in the church house again. I expect that shouting will be heard, songs will be sung, and tambourines will be played just like the Israelites did when they crossed the Red Sea leaving the past behind.

We can leave the past behind and start anew because God's purpose for us is to redefine our way of worship and increase our method of praise. It is the very reason God redirected us and made us go through the wilderness.

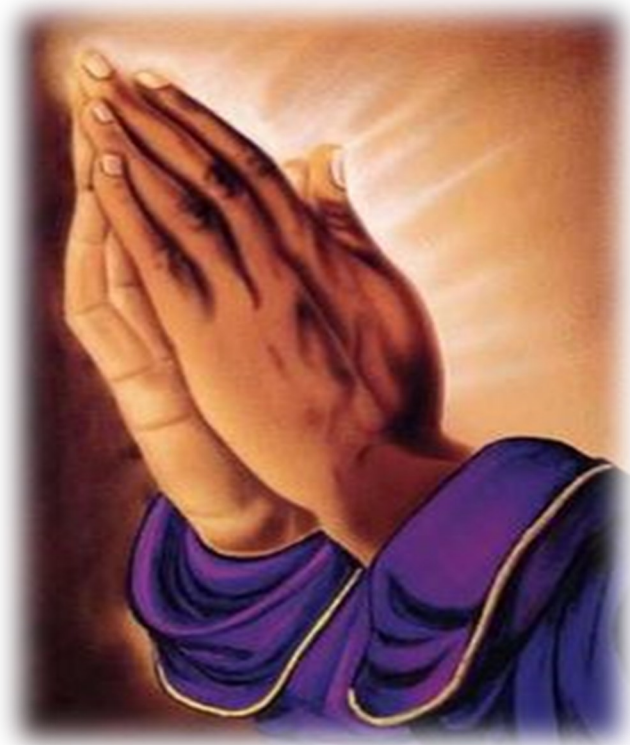

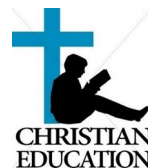

Kamala D. Harris
First Female Vice President
(Born October 20, 1964; age 56)

She is the daughter of immigrants; her father is a Jamaican professor emeritus at Stanford University and her mother is a cancer researcher from India.

Her name Kamala is from her Indian roots meaning 'lotus' and is another name for Lakshmi, the Hindu goddess of wealth, fortune, love, beauty, joy and prosperity.

She holds three degrees, bachelor's in political science and economics and a law degree.

She was the second Black woman and first South Asian-American to be sworn in as a senator.

She has written three books: The Truths We Hold: An American Journey; Smart on Crime and the children's book, Superheroes Are Everywhere.

She celebrates Hanukkah, Christmas and Kwanza.

She lives by these words from her mother, 'You may be the first, but make sure you're not the last.'

Of all her titles she is most proud of the title "Momala" as she is called by her stepchildren.

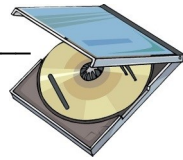
