We further engage to watch over, to pray for, to exhort and stir up each other unto every good word and work; to guard each other's reputation, not needlessly exposing the infirmities of others; to participate in each other's joys, and with tender sympathy bear one another's burdens and sorrows; to cultivate Christian courtesy; to be slow to give or take offense, but always ready for reconciliation, being mindful of the rules of the Saviour in the eighteenth chapter of Matthew, to secure it without delay; and through life, amid evil report, and good report, to seek to live to the glory of God, who hath called us out of darkness into his marvelous light.

When we remove from this place, we engage as soon as possible to unite with some other church where we can carry out the spirit of this covenant and the principles of God's Word.



A message from our Pastor

Praise the LORD, Saints!

“For the life was manifested” ¹ John 1:2) KJV

Life is Jesus Christ. He is the way, the truth and the life. The Lord saw fit to pass life on to us and also offer us eternal life but only through Him. The life that we live, we live by the grace of God. God’s grace is amazing in such that it has saved us, sustains us and sanctifies us.







John Stewart Rock

Teacher, Dentist, Doctor, Abolitionist & Lawyer
(October 13, 1825 —December 3, 1866)

Born in Salem, New Jersey to free African American parents during a time when it was rare for white children to finish grammar school and even more so for blacks. His parents encourage him in his studies and found a way to provide for his formal schooling. By age 19 he had the needed education to be a teacher. He started out in a one room school in Salem and continued to work for four years, holding classes for six hours, private tutoring sessions for two hours and studying medicine under two white physicians who allowed him to study their textbooks and use their personal book collections for eight hours daily. He would complete the necessary apprenticeship with practicing doctors as a means of gaining medical training. In 1848 after being denied admittance to medical school based on his race, he changed his field to dentistry.

He completed his dental apprenticeship in 1849 with Dr. Harbert, a white dentist and opened a dental practice in Philadelphia in January of 1850. He was awarded a silver medal for his expert work on a set of silver dentures he crafted and were later displayed. Finally getting accepted to the American Medical College in Philadelphia he graduated with his medical degree, making him one of the first African American to obtain a medical degree. By the age of 27 he was established as a talented and well-respected teacher, dentist and physician.

In 1852 Rock moved to Boston, opening his own dental and medical practice while teaching night school to African American. He was later hired by Vigilance Committee, an abolitionist group to treat and educate escaped slaves. In the late 1850's his health started to decline and was advised to retire and slow down. Rock instead cut back on his dental and medical practices and studied law. He became one of the first Black lawyers admitted to the Massachusetts bar in 1861 and four years later the first Black lawyer admitted to the bar of the Supreme Court on February 1, 1865 the day after the 13th Amendment was passed. His declining health prevented him from fully exercising this hallmark privilege. He died of tuberculosis in December 1866 at the age of 41. He was laid to rest with full Masonic honors and his admittance into the Supreme Court is recorded on his tombstone.
