

A message from our Pastor

Praise the LORD, Saints!

“In John 17, Jesus prays for the church. It is concerning to know how many others pray for the church as Jesus does. The prayers that go forward are not always for the advancement of God’s kingdom, but rather for personal agendas.

While church buildings have been closed by governments recommendations, some churches never stopped meeting at their respective churches. As an obvious violation of Romans 13:1-2, it does not seem to phase some church leaders that they have put their memberships in precarious situations. They seemingly challenge the members to obey God or man, which should not be the case. It is a challenge that I don’t think is necessarily a fair way to test membership faith.

If we had a nuclear disaster to occur and deadly radiation filled the air, would we still challenge members to illustrate trust in God by going to church? I don’t think so. Government has given us many reasons not to trust them and the Bible commands us to not put our trust in them. That means, do not trust government with your life, body or soul. I think we have to use some common sense along through here because Jesus warned us of these times.

We have had Saints die prematurely from COVID-19 even while they quarantined at home. Some of the other Saints have been at death’s door with this terrible, invisible, destructive virus and it is showing wear and tear on all of us. We have exercised every measure of our faith to protect our families, friends and foes. In our prayers, we have looked for help, waited on answers and surveyed the land. It appears to me that the land is infected, answers are questionable, and help is slowly coming because some people have chosen a time such as this to obey God rather than man by going to the church building. SMH.

When we pick and choose to obey God, it is more about our egos being satisfied than pleasing God. Selective obedience is not in the Bible. We are to either be hot or cold when it comes to obedience. Jesus spews the lukewarm from His mouth. If we opened the building and had everyone come back, what guarantees do we have pertaining to their safe welfare? Your health and safety are high priority to me. The shouting and dancing together can come later.

While we are away from the church building, let's keep praying for it to reopen for the purpose of serving rather than being served. Take the time during the pandemic to strengthen your faith and prayer life. Use your spiritual gifts to envision how you will serve upon your return to the building. If you return in the same pre-pandemic spirit, you obviously have not grown. Obviously, you will need a little more sincere milk of the Word of God because you are not ready for solid food.

I am in daily prayer for our church and the Saints. I believe that God wants a stronger, consistent, more faithful group of Saints to do His will and he is counting on us. The hymn writer said, "Blessed Savior, count on me." Can the Lord count on you? I pray that He can count on you.

Pray my strength in the Lord, too. This journey is just beginning. It may get a little rough riding along the way. So, grip the cross, check your spiritual gauge, put your prayer belts on and hang on.



FEMA COVID-19

Funeral Assistance

Under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021 and the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, FEMA will provide financial assistance for COVID-19-related funeral expenses incurred after January 20, 2020.

FEMA will begin to implement COVID-19 funeral assistance in April. In the meantime, people who have COVID-19 funeral expenses are encouraged to keep and gather documentation.

Who is Eligible?

To be eligible for funeral assistance, you must meet these conditions:

- The death must have occurred in the United States, including the U.S. territories, and the District of Columbia.
- The death certificate must indicate the death was attributed to COVID-19.
- The applicant must be a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or qualified alien who incurred funeral expenses after January 20, 2020.
- There is no requirement for the deceased person to have been a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or qualified alien.

How to Apply

Applications are being accepting applications. If you had COVID-19 funeral expenses, we encourage you to keep and gather documentation. Types of information should include:

- An official death certificate that attributes the death directly or indirectly to COVID-19 and shows that the death occurred in the United States, including the U.S. territories, and the District of Columbia.
- Funeral expenses documents (receipts, funeral home contract, etc.) that includes the applicant's name, the deceased person's name, the amount of funeral expenses, and the dates the funeral expenses happened.
- Proof of funds received from other sources specifically for use toward funeral costs. We are not able to duplicate benefits received from burial or funeral insurance, financial assistance received from voluntary agencies, government agencies, or other sources.

W. E. B. DuBois

Civil Rights Activist

(Feb. 23, 1868—Aug.27, 1963 Age: 95)

His full name is William Edward Burghardt DuBois to Alfred and Mary Silvinia both descendants of mixed-race.

He considered himself a mulatto in the mostly white American town. He attended school with white people and was enthusiastically supported in his studies by white teachers until his graduation from high school.

While attending Fisk University in Nashville Tennessee in 1885, he began to see the manifestation of the Jim Crow laws, when he started seeing racism in America for the first time.

He was the first African American to get a Ph.D. from Harvard in 1895.

From 1896 – 1897 he conducted the first major case study of a black community in the United States. The results were published in 1899, "The Philadelphia Negro: A Social Study".

He became a citizen of Ghana, giving him dual citizenship, he never gave up his US citizenship.

He died in Accra Ghana on August 28, 1963 at the age of 95. He died one day before Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. have his "I have a Dream" speech in Washington, D.C.
